Meeting called to Order: 6:07 pm

Minutes from Previous Meeting: Motion made to approve by Krista D., Seconded by Wendy J., all parties in favour, motion carried.

Agenda for Present Meeting: Krista D. motions to approve, Trudy F. seconded, all parties in favour, motion carried.

President/Vice-President: Chantelle C./open position

- We will be holding a craft night during Purdy's/Pointsettia pick up, and will request volunteers from parents, hopefully 3+ craft tables/activities. Event will begin at 6pm. Aimee S. made a motion to budget \$200 for craft and concession supplies, Krista D. seconded, all parties in favour, motion carried.
- The gift shop will run December 14th, and 15th
- Hot lunch day is December 1st and will be Spaghetti Day.
- Next bottle drive is currently schedule for January 6th or 7th; Action: Chantelle C. will confirm the date booked.
- Dance made \$237, with some chaos ordering concession supplies. Teachers expressed concern about doing class competitions, so prize was shifted to a door prize. More volunteers are needed.
- Discussion raised regarding volunteers bringing younger children; <u>Action: Chantelle C.</u> will work on a "How to volunteer with children" information/letter for parents.
- Eagle Ridge Centre is offering a fundraising idea, schools volunteer to decorate a tree and vendors/patrons vote on their favourite, and the tree voted best wins 10% of funds made. Vetoed for this year as there's already so much going on around Christmas time.
- Will book next dance soon.

Treasurer: Chantelle C. in lieu of Danielle P.S.

- Accounts have been opened at Coast Capital, will organize cheque signing authorizations.
- On the budget summary we had removed the DARE budget line last year (not seeing any expenses billed to this budget line), but we have since received a letter requesting a recommended amount of \$12 per Grade 5 student. Aimee S. motioned to approve a budget of \$366 to support the DARE program, Trudy F. seconded, all parties in favour, motion carried.
- Request made for the PAC to support the school WITS program, at an estimate of \$120 per year. Krista D. motions to approve \$120 for WITS and Trudy F. seconds, all parties in favour, motion carried. This raised the discussion of additional fundraisers to support these expenses that hadn't previously been budgeted for.
- Teachers are starting to ask what is left in their PAC accounts, and concerns voiced about delayed fees posting, discussion raised regarding solutions keeping a ledger in Gord J.'s office, or encouraging teachers to track their expenses.
- The coffee morning attempt was a semi-success, discussion raised regarding possibly adding cider or hot chocolate. Seems like it would be worth another try.

Garden: Krista D.

- Growing Schools program has emailed several workshop options, which were read out loud for consideration.
- Made \$512 from the Fall Vesey's order
- Kindies went on a field trip to Sunriver Gardens, got to use the cob pizza oven. The students reported it as a success!

• Had an Open House Thank You for contributors to the garden. It was a nice evening for it too!

Fundraising:

- Had approximately 77 books sold this year, a profit of \$937. This will be whittled down by the cost of the prizes promised to top sellers. Discussion regarding what the prizes should be, encouraged to spend \$100 on a prize box that students can choose from.
