Here is a little tip for finding books in the library. Instead of using the default Basic search [tab #1], click on the Copy Categories [tab #4] to find book collections that align with your curricular and literacy needs.

Over the past few years, our John Muir Collection has been organized to make it easier to find books. A reminder that **SUBLOCATION** means *where* you can find the book in the library. **COPY CATEGORIES** means a group of *books that are alike*.

You can search for books from the comfort of your classroom or at home! We have an amazing collection with fantastic titles that are current and help to support your program. Let me know if you have any book requests before the end of the school year and I'll add them to our final wish list.
